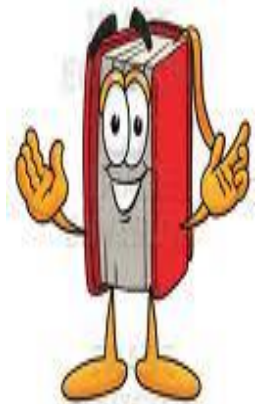

HOMEWORK CLUB:

Mid-week, students will have the chance to work on homework and study for tests in a classroom environment assisted by Mrs. Palmer. They will be taught basic study skills and habits that will help them for years to come and will be in a quiet environment that will be very conducive to their learning. Also, students will be given the chance to study with other peers in their grade level.

Teacher: Mrs. Palmer (Formerly Miss Herrel)

Eligible Students: K-6

Required Materials: Homework and textbooks

Time: Wednesday, 3pm-4pm

CREATIVE WRITING GRADES K-3

This enrichment course is designed to inspire students in the creative writing process. We will closely examine different writing styles of current published authors to further develop their own writing styles. At the end of the course, students will have five different writing pieces in their portfolio.

Eligible Students: 1st-2nd grade

Required Materials: 2 sharpened pencils and colored pencils

Time: Tuesday or Wednesday 3pm-4pm. Once a week

DRAMA, VOICE, AND PUBLIC SPEAKING:

Students will learn how to use their own confidence in creating stage presence and voice projection. Students will be introduced to basic ideas of the modern theatre and theatrical performing.

Eligible Students: 3rd-8th grade

Required materials: None

Time: Friday, 3pm-4pm. Once a week

WOODCRAFT CLUB:

Students will be given a very fun introductory course in woodworking. Students will be introduced to the various types of woods that are commonly used in the construction and building of fine wood furniture and cabinetry. They will be working hands-on in making and finishing their wood projects. They will learn proper painting and staining techniques as well as the different types of finishes that are available associated with woodworking projects. Wood projects for the club will include making a cross, a picture frame, and wood signs that will express their faith in God. By the end of the six weeks, students will better understand the processes and steps in doing woodworking and hopefully develop a joy for the craft.

Required Materials: None.

Time: Friday, 3pm-4pm. Once a week.

COMPUTER ADVENTURES CLUB - Beginner (Gr. K):

This class introduces students to basic computer skills and allows them to be comfortable with it. Students will learn mouse clicking techniques, keyboard keys, drawing and printing. They will use an award winning online resource (Jumpstart) that will further their skills in reading, math, art and critical thinking through fun-filled learning games.

Eligible Students: Kinder

Required Materials: none

Time: Tuesday, 3pm-4pm Once a week

COMPUTER ADVENTURES CLUB - Beginner (Gr.1-4):

This class offers primary grades an opportunity to create a variety of projects using KidPix 3D and explore online learning games. KidPix 3D is an award winning creativity software students can use to share ideas, imagination, and understanding through a combination of text, original artwork, voice narration, sound, 3D pictures and animation. Every project encourages thinking, collaboration and communication skills.

Eligible Students: Gr. 1-4

Required Materials: USB flash drive (at least 1GB)

Time: Thursday, 3pm-4pm, Once a week

COMPUTER ADVENTURES CLUB - Advanced (Gr. 5-8):

This class introduces students to website making and blogging. Students will learn to setup interactive websites and start a blog of their favorite topics. Students will learn how to add interactive elements to their websites such as music, videos, counters, guest books and widgets that are fun to share with others. Projects promote creativity and help develop 21st century skills.

Eligible Students: Gr. 5-8

Required Materials: USB flash drive (at least 1GB)

Time: Friday, 3pm-4pm, Once a week

POETRY APPRECIATION:

Students will participate in classes that introduce poetry and literary terms. They will be exposed to various forms of poetry, and learn to write their own poems in relation to the literary devices studied, such as metaphor and alliteration. By the end of six weeks, they will have a better grasp of poetic terms and a greater appreciation for poetry.

Eligible Students: 3rd -6th Grade

Required Materials: markers, crayons, pens, and pencils

Time: Tuesday, 3-4pm. Once a week

AUTHOR A CHILDREN'S BOOK:

Students will write their own children's book. They will bring in one or more of their favorite children's books, such as Brown Bear, Bear by Eric Carle. By the end of six weeks, they will have written and illustrated their own book!

Eligible Students: 4th -6th Grade

Required Materials: markers, crayons, pens, and pencils. *Additional fee of \$4 for a publishing book included in check.*

Time: Thursday, 3-4pm. Once a week

3RD GRADE MATH ENRICHMENT:

This enrichment will provide a Small group setting for 3rd grade students who need a little extra assistance on math concepts taught at the given moment, various concepts that will come up in the future and old concepts that he/she needs refreshment on. We will have a fun and lively atmosphere that will incorporate games, hands on tasks, art projects and group work.

Eligible Students: 3rd grade

Required Materials: Pencil and math notebook

Time: Tuesday, 3pm-4pm, once a week

CHESS CLUB:

Students will learn about chess pieces, set-up, strategies, and rules for the first two sessions. They will then focus on chess competition and strategy for the remaining four weeks. Students will also have the opportunity to challenge and compete against other students of different age levels and participate in a club competition. By the end of six weeks, students will understand the game of chess and be able to play it for years to come.

Teacher: Mr. Sumner

Eligible Students: 2nd - 8th grade

Required Materials: Portable chess board and pieces that can be brought to class

Time: Wednesday, 3pm - 4pm. Once a week

GUITAR:

Students will continue the preliminary classes that introduce basic singing and playing using the guitar (prior experience preferred). They will continue to be introduced to music theory, learning basic chords, practicing various strumming methods, and learning to sing along with popular songs while playing the guitar.

Required Materials: Guitar (acoustic or electric) & tuner
